MUSIC AT ST. MARY'S 2014-2015 needs you! (see page 5) Our Catechism, in the back of our Book of Common Prayer, tells us all about being an Episcopalian. We use it to teach our children, to refresh our own memories and often just to answer a question we have. It begins on page 845.

So, I want to explore the Sacraments. " ... Sacraments are outward and visible signs of inward and spiritual grace, given by Christ as sure and certain means by which we receive that

grace." BCP 857

"What is Grace? Grace is God's favor towards us, unearned and undeserved; by grace God forgives our sins, enlightens our minds, stirs our hearts, and strengthens our wills." BCP 858

Many of us have experienced Baptism, a very important sacrament of the church. In the Episcopal Church we believe we only need one Baptism to have God adopts us as His own. Once we are Baptized, we

forever belong to God. Read BCP 858

A Word from Our Rector

Each Sunday (and other times) we have Holy Eucharist. This is another sacrament that brings us to a deeper relationship with God and God's grace. Read BCP 859

This hymn tells the story of the life of Jesus in one song, and this uplifting

tune that has stayed with me all these years. If you haven't seen the movie Lilies of the Field, I encourage you to catch it next time it is on television. There is a battle of wills that takes place between Homer Smith played by Poitier and Mother Maria, who seems to be the boss nun in a desert dwelling for nuns who are living off the land. Homer is passing by needing water for his car; Mother Maria is on a "mission from God" in her wanting a chapel built (by Homer) for the local people. One big problem: the nuns have no money and Homer wants to move on.

Battle of Wills. I am so familiar with this phrase as

God when our minds and hearts take them seriously.

Confirmation is a serious adult "rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and laying on of hands by a Bishop." This is a serious commitment. BCP 860

Ordination is a process toward a calling in the church to become a Deacon or a Priest. Authority is given by God through the hands of a Bishop. BCP 860

Most of us understand that being married (Holy Matrimony) in the church is a Christian marriage with all the aspects of an intention to live a life of putting God first in the combination of two lives. BCP 861

Reconciliation of a Penitent is the "rite in which those who repent of their sins may confess them to God in the presence of a priest, and receive the assurance of pardon and grace of absolution." I hear confessions anytime with an appointment. BCP 861

And finally, Unction of the Sick is the rite of anointing the sick with oil. I take my oil with me to the hospital or someone's home in a round portable vile. This oil has been blessed by a Bishop and I pick up a new supply when I go to Procter

for Easter renewal of my ordination vows in Holy Week. BCP 861

I hope this was helpful as we rediscover what it means to be an Episcopalian! Please call me with questions or to make an appointment to meet with me.

An arrangement of the old Irish hymn, *Be Thou My Vision* will lead off the program. The very lovely, *Pavane* by Faure follows. Dear church family,

Happy March! The snow is gone and now we have sun shine, rain and heat, lots of heat to look forward to.

Getting started into a new year is exciting don't you think? There are new goals to set, concerns to be addressed and work to be done!

As some of you know we now have a Building and Grounds Committee. Larry Wiley, Randy Martin and Roy Goerler have graciously volunteered. These men can take care of so many things that need attention. They will also give us a heads up on jobs that need to contracted out.

This year we have decided to prioritize our always growing list of things that need to be done. Safety is our first priority that includes smoke alarms/detectors in both buildings, locks checked and treated and or repaired, safety strips on back stairs painted. Basements will be cleaned out, any safety problems addressed. Signs in hallways, exit signs where needed. By next winter we will have snow removal under contract that includes the sidewalks. This year we had more snow than usual and weren't prepared. So many of you have shoveled snow in the past so you know what a hard job it is. It's no job for anyone over... dare I say over 50ish. Larry Wiley shoveled all the side walks and took care of the salt this year as he often has done. We had a lot of snow. I feel certain that you will agree we can no longer allow any of our members to continue shoveling snow. New rule...if you are 50ish [and you know who you are] stay away from the snow shovel.

Lighting is another priority that we will be taking care of this year. It really is a safety issue that needs to be addressed.

We have something new we would like to try with your help. Randy came up with a great idea. A work/job order form. You will find them hanging on the board close to the 'coffee hour sign up sheet'. We hope that if you see anything that needs our attention please feel free to fill out the form so it can be taken care of. This form will also allow us to look back at what was done, when and cost. I know you will agree with me that if we take care of the 'small problems now, we won't have large costly problems later.

Speaking of jobs let us not forget that a job doesn't have to be handled by a hammer, screwdriver, saw and ladder job. There are jobs that are done inside the church building. Done with pots and pans, and spoons, knives hot soapy water, etc. Jobs that have wonderful results we all enjoy. Jobs done by the hands of women. Phyllis Johnson and Paul Johnson have been doing the job of 'Soup's On' and believe me it is no easy job. Soup's On feeds 70 to 80 folks a month! Shopping for food, shuffling it in the building. Sounds easy, well I did it this month due to Phyllis being ill and I want you to know it is a job, and it is not easy. And I will lock anyone in the freezer that disagrees with me. Thank you, Phyllis, you make us proud to be a church that feeds the homeless great food.
