#### **Exploring our time** together in Worship

Each Sunday we gather to become a community of worshipers, connected by our belief in God and our love for each other. It is a special time, a sacred time that draws us closer to our Creator. It's important and it really means a lot toward our spiritual growth.

Let's have a look at our time together. We gather in the sanctuary for peaceful quiet, getting ready to worship. This is an important time for many people. The quiet centers our mind on our Godly thoughts. Sit quietly and relax.

Then we open with a song of praise that causes us to stand (if you are able, it's OK not to stand) and welcome those who are with us in this journey of worship and praise. Sing if you can, the Lord loves happy voices, but if you can't sing, close your eyes and listen to the surrounding voices lifting you up in joy.

Next, we pray. We ask for open hearts, for God's presence to fill the room, our hearts and our minds. We then end with a glorious song of praise, the Gloria. Again, sing if you can, close your eyes and enjoy if you want. There is a sense that God is near and we are part of something much bigger than we are!

Next, to confirm our time together, we hear the Word of God. You may not realize this but we are reading more scripture every Sunday than most churches; an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, an

epistle and the Gospel lesson. You can follow along in your insert in the bulletin or you can just listen to the reader. Either way it is mindful. Then, as God places the Words of today in the heart of our preacher, we hear what is meant to be our actions of the Spirit. My sermons are short, to the point, and I always give you something to take with you to ponder each week. This makes our time together in worship extend throughout the week. You might question or not agree, but at least you can think about it!

# SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

Your vestry met July 20th, the day before this article was due to John Glaze for publication. I have my seven year old great-grandson with me this week, so I have a legitimate excuse for being a little tardy. But, the actual truth is that I wanted to write about a couple of the actions taken by your vestry that I feel you, the congregation, need to know.

Rev. Judi asked that the vestry approve the expenditure of \$2100.00 to fund the 2014-15 Education for Ministry (EfM) class. As was explained to us, the vestry, the funds need to be made available to early August for the registration fee for approximately seven individuals that have signed up for this year's class. We were asked to consider these funds as a scholarship for education. The rea-

son given was that the people attending are on fixed incomes and could only afford to pay \$50.00 of the \$350.00 registration fee.

After much discussion and debate among the vestry members, a motion was made and seconded that the vestry approve the funding as a scholarship of \$2100.00 for the 2014-15 EfM class. The motion was approved with one abstention. I am reporting this information to you in the hope that we might receive donations to help defray this expense that was not part of our 2014 budget.

I would like to recognize and thank Judy Franklin, who, at our last vestry meeting, volunteered to purchase a new handicap toilet for the ladies' restroom if we could provide a plumber to install it. The Junior Warden met with WOW Plumbing and secured an estimate for that installation as well as to remove and replace the cracked sink in the men's restroom. A replacement sink had been donated some time ago, so the only expense involved is the installation. The vestry approved the estimate of approximately \$285.

I hope that these vestry actions will meet with your approval and I would appreciate any comments or feedback, negative or positive.

Best wishes to all for a happy and enjoyable August. Maybe August will finally be the beginning of summer.

by our being there, inviting others to join us and welcoming them to our activities and church functions. Your smiles and friendliness cause people to question why you are the way you are. If they ask, tell them how God has enriched your life!

At VBS, we encourage the children to invite their friends to Sunday School and VBS. We need to endlessly seek open doors, pushing the doors that seem to be open, taking advantage of opportunities, asking the Holy Spirit to embolden and empower us and speak through us. True, you are a witness through your living, but people cannot guess why you are a good neighbor unless you openly tell them about Jesus and how He has worked in your life.

Think you can't do that? Trust in the Lord! Several years ago I was in a Women's Prayer Group that met once a week. Many of them had never spoken a prayer out loud. After four weeks, they all felt comfortable doing so. They saw the power of prayer changing their lives and those of their loved ones for the better. All expressed a new feeling of God's presence and His power working through them. We've got to spread the love, the joy, the very Kingdom of God!
