A Word from Our Rector

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

I heard something on TV the other day and it stuck with me. I don't remember the show it was on or why it was said but here it is: "If vou have saved one life in your lifetime, then you have done what you are supposed to do." I bring this up because I ran across a letter the other day that I've had for many years. I used to speak to groups of drug and alcohol offenders as a part of my healing from my son's death. The offenders would have to attend an all week end program and my part was telling how a decision to drive while intoxicated can ruin the lives of others. Though most of the groups were men, one group was filled with women. One of

the young women in the group sent me a letter a few weeks after she had attended the program. In that letter she told me how I saved her life and the life of her unborn child. She said she would never drink and drive again, and she said all of that was because I shared my story. What a wonderful thing to be told, and what a wonderful thing to carry with you through life! Doing those presentations was extremely hard and heart wrenching for me, but I could see where it was helping me. And I had always hoped that I would reach one person....just one.

Because of Ronnie's death and other things, I had lost my faith. In fact, back then I couldn't tell you when I had any faith. I blamed God for all the bad things in my life and told him so daily. Since I was so angry with God, going to church was out of the question.

Fast forward to the present. I'm at St. Mary's Episcopal Church. I've been confirmed by Bishop Tom. Being Senior Warden, I work closely with Rev. Judi, and I am on your Vestry. Needless to say, my faith has been restored.

So, whose life was saved? God has a way of being in all things. God understands our times of sorrow, grief, and lapses in faith. He has a way of knowing when we are ready for healing. He (continued on page 2)






