SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

As we enter the season of Advent in our church, we are also planning for the new year and part of that planning includes providing a budget for 2015. This is to be presented at our annual meeting scheduled for January 25, 2015. An important part of preparing a budget is knowing how much income will be available to support that budget. The sources of St. Mary's income are pledges from the congregation, open plate, apartment rental, building use donations, other income and investment income. Our investment income comes from investments at PNC Bank, as well as NBT Bank in Wilmington. That interest income varies according to the rise and fall of the stock market. We cannot use the principal of the Trust at NBT Bank, therefore we rely on the interest income. The principal from our investment/endowments at PNC is being drawn down at a rate of \$50,000.00 each year in order to support

a deficit budget. The draw down of the principal results in a decrease of yearly interest income.

As most of you know, St. Mary's is the beneficiary of a Trust from the Martha Chaney Estate which was given to the Trustees of the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio and reads: "with the request that the income and principal be used as Trustees may determine for the benefit of St. Mary's Episcopal Church, Hillsboro." National Bank & Trust of Wilmington was the Trustee of the Martha Chanev Estate and I was informed on October 14th by Janet Dixon of NBT that a check for \$500,431.04 was being delivered to the Trustees of the Diocese to invest. The Trustees of the Diocese will be meeting in early December and hopefully will determine how we are to benefit from this wonderful gift. To my knowledge the Jack Chaney Estate has not been settled as of yet according to Ms. Dixon

Why am I sharing this information with you? To inform and clarify our finances and because I think that we need to be more financially responsible in how we use and spend the gifts of past parish members who cared enough about the future of St. Mary's to remember us in their estates. All of our investment income was given by past members of St. Mary's. How are we honoring them? What are we doing for the future of St. Mary's to insure that she will be here for our families and other families who will be seeking a church home? I guess what I am saying is that when future budgets are being planned that we won't always have a source to make up the short fall and then what?

My best wishes to each of you for a Blessed Christmas.
