





Vestry Highlights for December

It's time again to make up the budget for St. Mary's Episcopal Church. We know that many in the congregation would prefer not to put pledges on paper. The finance committee needs your pledge to set a reasonable budget. This committee used last year's expenses and income to set up the tentative budget. Remember we've been blessed with endowments but they can only spent in certain circumstances. We need \$10,000 per month to pay our bills for water, sewer, gas, electric, salary, custodian, secretary and organist, copier, paper, newsletter, stamps, phones, office supplies, cleaning supplies, Mission Share and contributions to local charities and Soup's On. Your contribution is needed and appreciated.

Kim McGuire-Haines will join the Vestry to fill Carolinn's position for the next 14 months. She will serve as Chancellor, our legal representative. We found that we could add her in accordance with the Canons.

The Church By-Laws have been brought up to date.

Contributions have been made to the Pregnancy Center, Samaritan Outreach, the Homeless Shelter and Shiloh (Hillsboro's Drug Rehab Center) for the year.
