- 1854 Approximate time the house was built
- 1860 Buckner & Rider
- 1868 F. H. Reed
- 1895 Mrs. S. M. Boyer
- 1899 Flora McConnaughey
- 1951 Leone McConnaughey Rogers
- 1957 Nelle Wilkin Finley

The first blacksmith shop in Hillsboro was located where St. Mary's now sits. It was owned by Allen Trimble. When it was torn down, many of the timbers were used in constructing the house on Lot #37.
