### Home Tour-2019

The Biennial Highland County Historical Society Home Tour will be held on June 23 this year. There are 8 homes and 2 historic buildings on the tour. Watch for publicity! Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$5 for children and are available at Highland House, Warren Furniture, Cundiff's Flowers. Appearances Salon and Gibbs Insurance.

St. Mary's is on the tour this year and we need help. You will not have to lead tours, but just be available to direct folks and answer any questions they may have. The self-guided tour through the building will be led by information sheets posted at key spots to inform the visitors and then direct them to the next point of interest. To prepare you, we will provide this information to you prior to the tour, so you can familiarize yourself with the history and be able to easily find an answer if someone should ask something you don't already know. In addition, we will need someone to work in the History Room to handle any sales that may be needed. This will require about 10 to 15 minutes training—it is very easy. The computer figures the tax and even how much change to give. We don't anticipate a lot of sales, so the job will be very easy.


