



Greystone—Home of George & Nannie

George B. Beecher went to Yale (Class of 1861) and studied for the ministry at the Andover Theological Seminary, and was ordained in the Presbyterian Church. He pastored juntil 1879 when he was asked to help out with the business affairs of Colonel Trimble. Here he joined St. Mary's Episcopal Church where he periodically delivered sermons, assisted the Rectors in services and, late in life, served as Senior Warden for many years. The Beechers built their home, "Greystone," between 1879 and 1882 on land obtained from Col. Trimble. This home, originally containing some thirty rooms, cost \$150,000 (in today's funds, over \$3.7 million.)

#### Where Are My Blessings?

Do you wonder why some people seem blessed and you feel "skipped over"? We know from scripture that God loves us and wishes to bless His children. (Matt. 7:4) God knows our hearts, our talents, and His plans for us. So if God chooses not to bless us in a certain way, that could be a blessing in itself. Here are several reasons why God may not be blessing your life:

- 1. You haven't asked for the blessing. Start asking specifically and see what God wants toteach you about asking, trusting, and being thankful.
- 2. You haven't asked in faith. You must truely believe "that you have received it and it will be yours." (Mark 9:23) Or pray "help me overcome my disbelief." (Mark 9:24)
- 3. You're asking with the wrong motive. God isn't going to help you win the lottery "so you can spend on your own pleasures." (James 4:3) "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart." (Psalm 37:4)
- 4. You're all about you. All your complaints are about "I", "me", "my". God isn't a glorified Santa Claus. Nor is He obligated to bless any of us. You need to be all about Him. (Luke 9:23) You have to die to self. Ask to be a blessing to God. (Galations 2:20)

Since no one responded to my question last month, I have decided to inflict upon you the lessons about our hymnal in the Red Door on monthly installments. The Episcopal Church requires that the words of hymns be from officially approved sources, making the official hymnals perhaps more important than their counterparts elsewhere. Our hymnal was put together based on the Joint Commission's work by the Standing Commission on Church Music. It has a much expanded service music and chant section, which became necessary with the introduction of the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*.

In addition to the service music, the hymnal has 720 hymns and takes some steps toward multiculturalism, including eight hymns based on spirituals, two on Ghanaian work songs, two on Chinese hymns, two on "Amerindian" songs, one Hispanic-American song and one by a Mexican composer.

How is our hymnal arranged? If you look at the "Contents" pages near the front, you'll see that first in the book will be found the Service Music, broken down by The Daily Office, followed by The Great Litany, Liturgies for Special Days, Baptism, Eucharist and Canticles.

Next are The Hymns, divided by The Daily Office and then sections of hymns for each part of the Church Year. Following this are hymns for major events of the church, such as Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Marriage, etc. and then General hymns. Next are divisions of The Christian Life, Rounds and Canons and National Songs.

You think we're done? We're not to the back cover quite yet. Our book has several indexes. These will be covered in a future lesson. Meanwhile, If you plan to follow this series, it would be helpful for you to borrow one of the hymnals to have at home for reference and suggested readings. You should begin by reading the PREFACE, found 4 page turns from the front. I read the names of those involved in the project and see many names of past faculty of my times at Sewanee Church Music Conference.
