PILGRIM PRIEST'S PONDERINGS Dear St. Mary's Family,

BUILDING EACH OTHER UP

"...encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing."

I Thessalonians 5:11

Fellow ambassadors of Christ,

A passage from the Book of Exodus has captivated me over the last several weeks.

Right before this passage, we read that the children of Israel are being led by Moses out of Egypt to Mount Sinai, to receive the Ten Commandments from God. Along this journey, the Israelites meet fierce resistance from the Amalekites, who are old enemies of the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. To proceed further, the Israelites must battle the Amalekites. We pick up the story in Exodus 17:8-13:

⁸Then Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, "Choose some men for us and go out, fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." ¹⁰So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. "Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed. 12 But Moses' hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the sun set. 13 And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword.

The story relates how Moses, that mighty man of God, needed the assistance of two others (Aaron and Hur) to defeat the Amalekites. The Israelites would not have won the battle (and subsequently carried out their mission from God) unless Aaron and Hur had been by Moses' side to hold up his arms.
