SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

One Sunday a young man entered our church. There nothing outstanding about him, and his clothes showed a lot of wear....like he had been wearing them a long time. The service was already in progress so the ushers were seated and paying attention to the service. I sat there and watched the man off and on while I was reading. He didn't have a bulletin, he didn't grab a book. He just sat. I don't know why but, I was immediately suspicious of this young man. I wondered: Did he choose our church to hide from something? Was he going to rob us? Nothing good came to my mind. Now usually someone would come up to a new-

comer and give them a bulletin or offer assistance in some way. But no one did. Maybe no one noticed him. I wanted to go up to him and help but I didn't....because of my suspicions. After a while he left. I was still suspicious so I left my seat and went back to check the nursery and the back door thinking that he was coming in the back to steal or harm someone. I never saw the young man again.

I often think back on that Sunday and wonder what would have happened if I had offered some help to the young man. I think I would have been better for it, but I often wonder if he would have. Would my gesture of coming up to him in church and offering a hand made a difference to him? Maybe a difference in his life? My fear and my suspicion kept me from doing what I should have done. Kept me from doing the right thing.

I wonder if anyone else remembers that Sunday. Does anyone else wish they had gone up to that newcomer and offered help? Does anyone else which they had done something different that day?

That Sunday I don't remember the sermon, the lessons or the songs. I don't remember if I stayed for coffee hour, and if I did who I might have talked to. I don't (continued on page 2)
