I am, however, thankful that we are not totally cut off from worship. Our own Church service has been live streamed on Zoom on Sunday Mornings as we meet together with our Rev. We may slowly be getting back to a more normal life in some areas. Only a few necessary people will be in attendance uring the service with appropriate social distancing and wearing masks.
