Serving Schedule for NOVEMBER

100th Anniversary Coming Soon

In January of 2017, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the installation of the altar area.

The January 1917 diocesan magazine carried a story of happenings at St. Mary's. It reported on restoration and beautification work which had been completed. This included the altar work paid for by rector, Louis Durr in loving memory of his parents.

"The reredos, the panels and the dome—in fact, all parts show the touch and finish of true artists and the reverence of a godly son for worthy parents...."

In the mosaics, located on the left of the altar, is found the symbol of the letters I H S intertwined. This symbol began as I H C and originated in the Greek as a short form of IHCOYC, spelling out "Jesus." There is often a short horizontal line which signifies that the symbol is an abbreviation.

On the right side is the symbol of Chi Rho, which is an abbreviation for the word "Christ" in Greek. This is a very ancient symbol, found in early Christian catacombs. Christ's name in early Greek is spelled XPICTOC; Chi and Rho are the first two letters.
