#### **MUSIC AT ST. MARY'S PRESENTS** MUSIC OF THE CIVIL WAR

November 4, Music At St. Mary's Concert Series will host Steve Ball, of Columbus, who will present his program, MUSIC OF

THE CIVIL WAR. Mr. Ball specializes in the music of the American Civil War and has studied the war since his teens, devoting the past twenty years to studying the music of this era in American history. He has presented programs for the Ohio Statehouse, the National Civil War Museum, the American Civil War Museum of Ohio, and countless historical societies, genealogical societies, libraries, museums, Civil War Round Tables and other historical venues such as re-enactments or living history programs. He has released two CDs of the music of the Civil War and is currently working on a CD of Stephen Foster tunes. Steve has been an instructor for Life Long Learning through Central Ohio Technical College. He also provides the music for the annual Springfield Ohio Civil War Symposium, and is the narrator for the 73rd Ohio Volunteer Infantry Civil War Brass Band. He is a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and a member of the Civil War Preservation Trust. He has participated in the annual Windham New York Civil War Music Gathering, and the Gettysburg Music Muster at the Gettysburg Military Park visitor

THE MUSIC OF THE CIVIL WAR Mr. Ball's presentation features tunes starting in the mid-1850s that would become important regarding the climate of the country before the war began in 1861. As the presentation unfolds, there will be patriotic songs cherished by both sides as well as tunes that reflected the loss and melancholy the war would produce. The history and influence of each tune is shared, as well as the progress of the war itself. His presentation gives an excellent background to both the music of the Civil War, and the war itself. Steve has a family member who served in the war and his presentation usually includes that story.

#### YOU ARE BLESSED


Sometimes when we ask for God's blessing we forget that His blessing goes from us to others. We are supposed to be conduit Christians where our blessing extend through us to others.

2. What would she be known for in our sanctuary?

Answer: The Ascension window was given by Rev. and Mrs. George Beecher and Mrs. Beecher's cousin, Mrs. Ebenezer Buckingham, in memory of their aunt, Martha Trimble and her four sons, William, Clarence, Allen and Ebenezer. Martha was the wife of Col. Wm H. Trimble, who was the third son of Governor Allen Trimble. This window was installed about 1907. The window previously located in this place is now in Lacy Hall.
